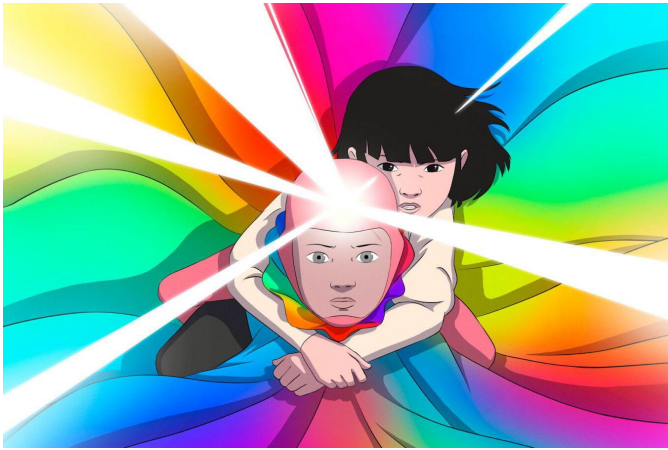

What if a rainbow arcing across the sky was more than a fleeting spectacle? What if it were the trail of a time traveller, bridging generations with a promise of a brighter tomorrow?

10-year-old Arco and his family live a serene life in a distant future, in an arboretum-like home floating in the sky. But restless and curious, Arco cannot resist adventure. One night, he sneaks past his family's anti-gravity pods and steals his sister's time-traveling costume to see dinosaurs. Things go awry, and he crash-lands in a forest, unexpectedly finding himself in the perilous year 2075, a world where robots have taken over human tasks, suburbs have become fireproof domes, and ecological crises isolate humanity.

There, he meets Iris, a girl his age, and together, with her loyal robot caretaker Mikki, they embark on a magical journey through time. They navigate a dazzling, beautifully animated world, forge a tender friendship, and discover that they may be the only ones who can save the planet.

Arco is a visually stunning and heartfelt adventure, blending time travel, environmental reflection, and the wonder of childhood curiosity into a story of friendship, courage, and hope for the future.

Schools considering a School Screening of **ARCO** are advised of the following content:

- Death of the robot.
- Close-up of a scar, with a bit of blood. Surgical procedure implied (the robot stitches Arco's scar, but the image stops at the thread passing through the eye of the needle).
- Low-impact car accident.
- Scenes of wildfires.
- Brief knockout of secondary characters.
- Arco is shirtless while receiving medical care.
- Some language: "débile", "idiot", "cafteuse"
- The robot appears in the dark with red eyes that can be slightly frightening.

Jean Valjean is released from prison after nineteen years of hard labour, violence, and suffering. Bitter and hardened by injustice, he has become a dangerous man who trusts no one. Arriving in a small village in Provence, he is repeatedly turned away. Desperate, he unknowingly finds refuge at the home of Bishop Bienvenu, who lives simply with his sister and a single servant. There, Valjean is met with unexpected warmth, and his inner demons begin to waver.

Yet the shadows of his past tempt him, and he steals the Bishop's silverware. When the police catch him, the Bishop forgives him and gifts him the candlesticks. This act of mercy sparks the transformation of Jean Valjean, setting him on a path to reclaim his humanity and become a new man.

The adaptation of the first 100 pages of Victor Hugo's novel *Les Misérables*, in which Jean Valjean encounters kindness for the first time.

- Minimal swearing and use of alcohol

What if Egypt's greatest treasure, the treasure of Pharaoh Khufu, were hidden in Paris?

Christian Robinson, a flamboyant archaeologist with unorthodox methods, is convinced it is, ever since discovering a mysterious inscription during recent excavations in Cairo. Determined to decipher the clues left by Dominique Vivant Denon, the first director of the Louvre, Robinson embarks on an extraordinary treasure hunt across Paris, from the dusty archives of the Louvre to the secret chambers of the Malmaison. He brings along his daughter Isis and his grandson Julien, driven by the audacious hope of making the greatest archaeological discovery of the 21st century right in the heart of Paris.

Directed by Barbara Schulz, the film draws inspiration from real historical events, including Napoleon's Egyptian expedition and the treasures brought back to France, skillfully blending history with fiction.

PG CLASSIFICATION - CONTENT WARNING

Schools considering the School Screening of **TREASURE HUNTERS: ON THE TRACKS OF KHUFU** are advised of the following content:

- The film has no particular content concerns, apart from a few mild fight scenes.
- Note that the grandfather encourages his grandson to lie to his school about his absence, in order to take him on the adventure.
- Regarding language: several French expressions such as “merde”, “putain”, “fait chier”, and “tu m’emmerdes” appear in the film. They are used in a natural, light-hearted, and friendly way, without any intention to be aggressive or insulting. In English, they would correspond to mild expressions such as “damn” or “leave me alone.”

Amélie is a little Belgian girl born in Japan, whose early childhood unfolds in a peculiar, gentle serenity. Until the age of two and a half, she experiences herself as a “tube”, a passive, almost vegetative being whose days are spent merely eating, sleeping, and existing. Then, one day, the world transforms into a place of wonder and discovery.

Over the next six months, Amélie explores language, connects with her parents and siblings, marvels at her paradise-like garden, and uncovers her passions (Japan and the rain), along with her dislikes (carps). She begins to perceive the passage of time, the changing seasons, and the joys and sorrows that, from the age of three, begin to shape a human life forever.

Visually, the animation enchants with soft pastel tones, delicate lines, and a dreamlike atmosphere infused with the poetry of 1960s Japan. Adapted from Amélie Nothomb’s novel *Little Amélie or the Character of Rain*, the film is a tender meditation on childhood, filled with wonder, nostalgia, joy, and gratitude.

- Themes of religion and faith (references to God/the divine).
- Scenes of children arguing, including brief physical fighting.
- Discussions of death and grief, including the death of the grandmother (but not pictured).
- Discussions related to war (but not pictured).
